## **Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee**

To mark 60 years of the Queen's reign, the Diamond Jubilee takes place in 2012. The celebrations will centre around an extended weekend - June 2nd to June 5th. The Parish Council is interested to hear of any ideas for marking this event in some way. Any suggestions should be sent to the Parish Clerk.

## **New Parish Councillors**

John Hinkly and David Rafferty were elected in May.

## **Parish Council's Planning Committee**

Planning applications are decided in this area by Chiltern District Council, but the Parish Council has a duty to comment on local applications and is consulted on wider planning policy. The Planning Committee meets every three weeks and a number of residents have taken the opportunity to address the committee, in the ten minutes allowed at the beginning of each meeting, about planning applications which affect them.

Agendas for all meetings are published on the Council's notice boards (outside the Village Hall and on Chenies Parade) at least three working days prior to the meeting.

## **Chiltern District Council Core Strategy**

The planning inspector is expected to publish his final report shortly and, the Core Strategy should therefore go to the Secretary of State some time in October. It will then be placed before the District Council Cabinet for adoption, probably in November.

## **Draft National Planning Policy Framework**

You will probably be aware of the controversy following the publication of this document. The Parish Council will be submitting a response to be agreed at the October meeting of the Planning Committee.

## **Telecom Masts**

The Parish Council objected to a planning application for a mast on the corner of Linfields and CDC refused permission. It has not objected to an application for one near the railway station.

Another application, for a mast on the roof of Jane Duncan Architects in Chalfont Station Road, is expected soon.

## Westwood Park car park

Now that the play area has been installed, a contract to re-surface the car park and approach road has been placed. The work should be completed by the end of October. There will be limited access to the park while work is underway.

## Street lights

With the exception of lights on the A404 and a few close to Nightingales Corner, all street lamps in Little Chalfont are the responsibility of the Parish Council. If you spot a light that is not working, please contact the Parish Council office giving the number of the lamp and the road it is in. We aim to get lights repaired very quickly but rely on residents to report problems.

## Vehicle Activated Sign in Elizabeth Avenue

A permanent speed indication sign has, at last, been installed in Elizabeth Avenue near the junction with Chenies Avenue.

These signs have been proved to help reduce average speeds.

The cost of the sign has been met by Bucks County Council from the delegated budget allocated to parishes and agreed by the Local Area Forum which covers Little Chalfont, Chalfont St. Peter, Chalfont St. Giles and Seer Green.

Our latest bid for funding from this budget is for dropped kerbs on the junctions of Russell Close and Bedford Avenue.

The next Local Area Forum meeting will be held in Little Chalfont Village Hall on Wednesday October 19th at 7.00 p.m.

The meeting is open to anyone.



## Minor Remedial Work

Recently, the Parish Council has carried minor works around the village previously carried out by the County Council e.g. keeping alley ways free of vegetation and pruning back of trees and shrubs to improve accessibility. This work has already been appreciated by residents.

Please report any similar instances to the Parish Clerk. Even if the Parish Council cannot do the necessary work it is possible for us to pass on any information to the relevant authority.

## Little Chalfont Community Library

Congratulations to Little Chalfont Community Library on winning a Queens Award for Voluntary Service. The award was presented by the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire at a ceremony in the library on September 30th

We also congratulate Jim Brooks, Chairman of the Friends of Little Chalfont Library, on his MBE, awarded in the Queens Birthday honours in June for services to the library.

The Parish Council gives financial support to the work of the library.

A Health Fair, jointly organised by CDC, Nexus and the Little Chalfont Community Association, was held in July at Dr. Challoner's High School. A number of local people attended and were able to receive advice on various health matters.

## Bell Lane School
